PY 2020 Round 2 Emergency Solutions Grant CARES Act (ESG-CV) Program Funding Availability

The Office of Community Development has funds available through Round 2 of the Emergency Solutions Grant CARES Act (ESG-CV) for renovation and street outreach. Supplemental funding for Round 1 Homeless Crisis Response Program (HCRP) CARES grantees for emergency shelter, alternate shelter, homelessness prevention and rapid re-housing is also available. Amended Attachment D for CDBG-funded Grants

Grants funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds (including CARES Act funds) included an incorrect Attachment D: Grantee Assurances and Certifications. Grantees with executed grant agreements should have received an amended Attachment D to sign and those with grants in the execution process received a full corrected grant agreement to sign and return.

Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant Program

The Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant program will help fund important water and wastewater infrastructure projects throughout Ohio. The program will provide nearly \$250 million in grant funding to Ohio communities.

Governor DeWine has announced the <u>three rounds of funding</u>, awarding nearly \$250 million to Ohio communities.

Funding Opportunities Available to Clean Up Blighted and Vacant Sites

The Ohio Department of Development is launching two new programs to help local communities fund brownfield cleanup and demolition projects. Program guidelines are now available on the program webpages. Applications will be available in the coming weeks.

The Brownfield Remediation Program provides grants for the remediation of brownfield sites throughout Ohio. Nearly \$350 million in funds are available. A \$1 million set-aside per county will be available until June 30, 2022. Remaining funds will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Demolition and Site Revitalization Program provides grants for the demolition of commercial and residential buildings and the revitalization of surrounding properties. Nearly \$150 million in funds are available. A \$500,000 set-aside per county will be available until June 30, 2022. Remaining funds will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Grant and Loan Programs Available to Ohio Businesses

Ohio Governor Mike DeWine and Lt. Governor Jon Husted announced grant and loan programs to help small, medium and minority-owned businesses recover from the impact of the coronavirus pandemic and help women and minority overcome obstacles to establishment and growth.

The <u>Women's Business Enterprise Loan Program</u> offers loans from \$45,000 up to \$500,000 at interest rates up to 3%. Loans can be repaid within 10 years for equipment and machinery and 15 years for owner-occupied real estate. Businesses must be at least 51% under ownership and control by women or be certified as a Women-owned Business Enterprise (WBE) in Ohio.

The Ohio Micro-Loan Program offers loans of \$10,000 up to \$45,000 at zero percent interest. Loans will be repaid within five years for permanent working capital and seven years for equipment. Businesses must be certified in Ohio as either a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) or a Women-owned Business Enterprise (WBE).

Four business grant programs are available as well:

- Food and Beverage Establishment Grant
- Entertainment Venue Grant

- Lodging Grant
- New Small Business Grant

The programs will provide \$155 million in grant funding to businesses that opened in 2020, food and beverage establishments, entertainment venues, and lodging venues. The funds were made available by the Ohio General Assembly as part of Senate Bill 108 and Senate Bill 109 in May.

All four programs will be administered by the Ohio Department of Development, formally Ohio Development Services Agency. Program guidelines, terms and conditions, and required documentation for all four programs are available now at https://businesshelp.ohio.gov/.
