# **Administrative Updates**

# Farewell, Marvin Rudd. Hello, Matt Spiess

After more than 10 years at Development, Marvin Rudd will retire on Monday, May 31<sup>st</sup>. Marvin has worked in the Office of Community Development's Residential Revitalization section for his entire state career. Prior to joining Development, he worked for the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission. We wish him well in his retirement.

Matthew Spiess joined Development as a Housing Grant Analyst in the Office of Community Development on May 5, 2021. Prior to joining Development, he was the Director of Special Projects at the Maumee Valley Regional Planning Commission where he was involved in five Community Housing Impact and Preservation (CHIP) partnership grants. Matt has nearly 15 years of experience as a private contractor, experience with the weatherization program, and more than 11 years of experience working with HOME and CDBG programs. Matt holds a

bachelor's degree from the University of Toledo and is a licensed Lead Based Paint Risk Assessor and Lead Abatement Contractor.

## **Section 3 Labor Hours Reporting Requirement**

Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, requires grantees to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by using HUD financial assistance are directed to low- and very low-income persons and to business concerns that provide economic opportunities to low- and very low-income persons to the greatest extent feasible. HUD recently issued new Section 3 implementing regulations that introduce "labor hours" as a new metric for measuring the effectiveness of Section 3 efforts. Section 3 requirements apply to HUD-assisted housing rehabilitation, housing construction, and other public construction projects when the total amount exceeds \$200,000 and is committed on or after July 1, 2021. Beginning in PY 2021, grantees will have to collect and report labor hours for "Section 3 Workers" and "Targeted Section 3 Workers" for each activity subject to Section 3 requirements. This requirement only applies to grants issued on or after July 1, 2021.

To meet this new reporting requirement, OCD is developing a solution for grantees to report labor hours in Salesforce. Once completed, OCD will provide grantees with instruction on how to enter the data. As HUD releases more clarification on these reporting requirements, OCD will share this information with grantees. #### Changes to Income Eligibility Calculator for PY 2021

On June 1, 2021, HUD will update the CPD Income Eligibility Calculator to reflect the PY 2021 Income Limits. The update will affect current and prior calculations for CDBG, HOME, CDBG-DR, HOPWA, and Housing Trust Fund. Current calculations in progress, and previously completed calculations based on FY 2020 Income Limits, will update based on the new income limits for 2021.

HUD strongly suggests making copies of your prior calculations for your records **before** they are updated by the PY 2021 on June 1, 2021. Once the Income Calculator is updated with the PY 2021 Income Limits, all calculations currently in a user's dashboard in the CPD Income Eligibility Calculator, as well as calculations completed going forward, will use the FY 2021 Income Limits for the purposes of determining eligibility. ## **PY 2021 Income Limits Effective Starting Tuesday**

Each year, HUD sets income limits that determine eligibility for assisted housing programs based on Median Family Income estimates and Fair Market Rent area definitions for each metropolitan area, parts of some metropolitan areas, and each non-metropolitan county. For all programs, except those funded with federal Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) dollars, the effective date is June 1, 2021. ESG limits are effective April 1, 2021. # SFY 2021 Fiscal Shutdown Begins June 15th

Each year in June, The State Accounting Office shuts down all payment processing for several weeks to begin the fiscal year closeout process.

Grantees should carefully consider their funding needs for the period from June 15, 2021 to July 1, 2021, to avoid payment delays and/or cash shortages during the shutdown period. In order to receive funds before this year-end shutdown begins, you must submit requests to draw funds **before 5 p.m. on Friday, June 15, 2021**. Any draw requests received after this time will not be processed for payment until July 1, 2021.
