About OCCD

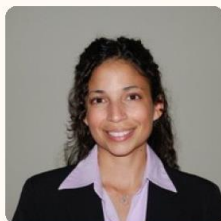
The Ohio Conference of Community Development, a statewide association of more than 175 community and economic development practitioners, works to enhance the livability of

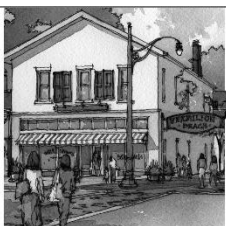

President's Award



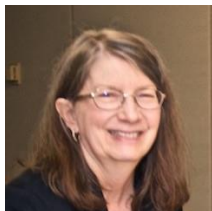

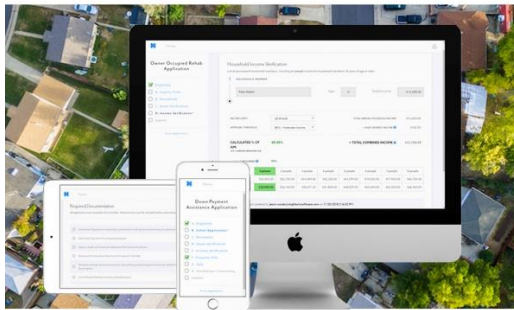

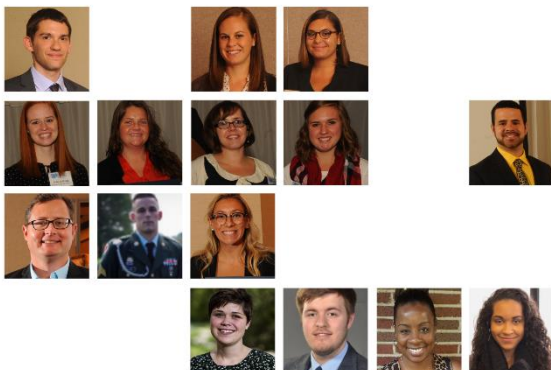
